## Mary Soth, in her own words...

I love the West Branch building and playground. All the years I attended workshops nothing compared to coming back here. I love the history beginning with help from the Rotary Club and the early leaders. It's all so rewarding. The architect was Kenneth Wing Sr. I met him and his wife and invited them the first year I was here. He was still a student at USC and this was his first project. He grew up near here in the early 1900s. What was a typical Nursery acquaintance turned into a good friendship. He was very proud especially of the entry and staircase. I was impressed with his design – the rooms and bathrooms and the way they all had access to the outdoors. Long before

preschools emphasized outside activities, LBDN began with gardening, pets and outdoor play. LBDN felt that outdoor play was as important as indoor education.

I was always impressed with the board and the staff and the respect and manners they showed. Even today, the way the teachers speak to the children – they are happy and have interesting things to do.

We had a great turn-out this year of students, family and friends. In particular, we had a number of new friends of the Nursery join us.

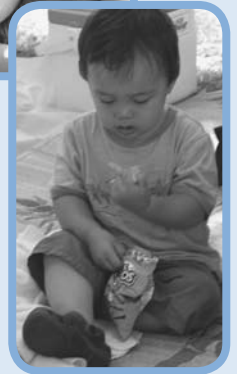
